



Event Registration in Edgerton

On February 16, we held "Event Registration and Beverage Tasting Workshop". Trudy Morris (House Manager), Sgt. Craig Martin (MIT Police), Dan Kirsch (Program Manager), and the Lermans (Warehouse Housemasters) were present. The wines were greatly enjoyed, but unfortunately that's not the point of this article... Here's a brief synopsis of how to register events, shamelessly recycled from a previous bulletin...

RESERVE the Lounge to make sure you can get the Edgerton Lounge on the night you want. Fill out a reservation form at the Front Desk from 8am-4pm, and pay a \$50 deposit check. This deposit holds your reservation, and returns to you after the party.

GET A SIGNATURE if you plan to serve alcohol in the Lounge. MIT has a very strict policy on the use of alcohol in any common lounge areas outside of your own apartment.

- At parties with <25 guests, and either a BYOB invitation or alcohol provided by you, obtain the alcohol registration form from the front desk and get a signature from House Manager Trudy Morris.

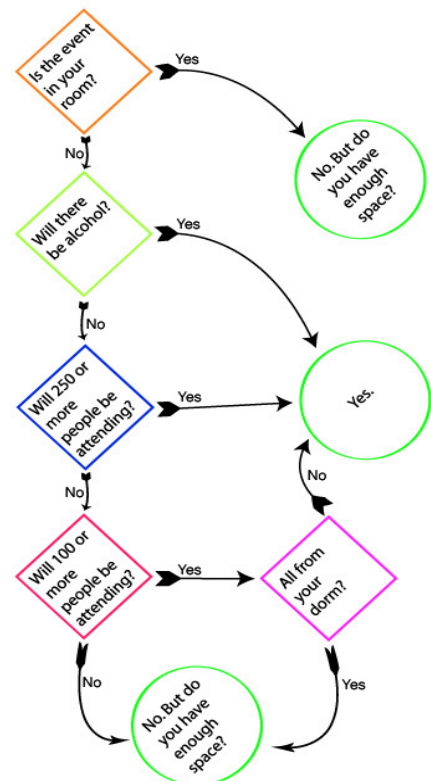
FOR PLANNING LARGER PARTIES, you may need to register the event with MIT Residential and Student Life Programs. Use this flowchart (right) to figure out the registration steps.

TO SUMMARIZE THE FLOWCHART, these types of parties have to be registered with MIT Residential and Student Life Programs:

- 1) Parties with >25 guests, where alcohol is served (see above steps for parties with alcohol but <25 guests, in graduate residences).
- 2) Any party with 100+ people, some of whom aren't from Edgerton.
- 3) Any party with 250+ people (like last year's spring formal, La Fete, held in the Edgerton courtyard).

Event Registration is a 7-step process, so plan ahead.
